

ENTRY RULES AND DRESS CODE FOR

Entry Rules:

- All Classes: A two minute call will be announced at the start of each class, if you do not arrive at the appropriate ring the class will start without you
- All times are approximate and subject to alteration
- Entry fees are due at the time of booking
- Entry fees are non-refundable
- A horse/pony may compete in any class once but not in the same class with a different rider
- No whips or spurs to be used in games or handy pony classes
- Spurs only to be worn by riders 16 years or over
- Owners of horses/ponies with specific breeding in relevant breed classes can be asked to produce the horses/ponies passport at any time
- Lead Rein All lead rein riders must always remain on the lead rein outside of the rings Lambley Riding Club will not be responsible for any lead rein competitors not adhering to this rule
- Lead Rein Riders must be 3 years old as of the first of January 2023 to enter any classes at Lambley Riding club
- Lead Rein Riders will not be allowed to enter any other classes off the lead rein except for step up classes
- Stallions or Colts must be handled or ridden by someone over the age of 16 years old
- Riders under the age of 18 years old must always wear a hard hat with chin strap
- Concours d'elegance competitors must sign a hat disclaimer form should they choose not to wear a hard hat (forms will be available to sign upon booking into the classes)
- Anyone wishing to compete in a beginner's class can't be entered alongside any other class competitively (you may enter additional classes non competitively – points will not be collated for club member in this case)

- Anyone who wishes to enter a beginners class it must be a combination of beginner horse/pony and rider
- Lambley Riding Club take no responsibility for any loss/damage to any rider, person, horse, pony or vehicle whilst on the show ground premises

Dress Codes:

Style and Appearance

Horse/Pony wear

- Lead rein: Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only and snaffle bits allowed, leader to be smartly dressed
- Other classes: Snaffle, Pelham or double bridle allowed. No saddle cloths, martingales, boots or schooling aids permitted on the horse. A dark shaped numnah is permitted

Rider wear

- Cream/beige jodhpurs, jacket, shirt, tie, gloves, helmet, showing cane and hair tied neatly
- Junior riders to wear Jodhpur boots
- Senior riders to wear Longboots

Working Hunter

Horse/Pony wear

- The is no requirement for a change of tack for horses/ponies during the Working Hunter classes although bridles should be plain with no colour
- No bandages or schooling aids to be worn on the horse
- Boots may be worn for the jumping phase at the judges discretion

Rider wear

- Cream/beige jodhpurs, tweed jacket, shirt, tie, gloves, helmet with harness, cane and hair tied neatly
- Junior riders to wear Jodhpur boots
- Senior riders to wear Longboots
- A body protector is permitted for both phases of the class
